8. Consent agenda items for approval, acknowledgement, and/or adoption:
 - (a) Approval of the meeting minutes for the regular city council meeting on July 14, 2022.
 - (b) Approval of an ordinance establishing a stop intersection at Dixon Avenue and Dixon Street.
 - (c) Approval of an ordinance establishing a no parking zone on both sides of West Kivett Street between South Church Street and South Park Street.
